WHEREAS, the university encourages student participation and the development of leadership skills

WHEREAS, student groups represent one of the most equitable and accessible opportunities for students to learn and develop their leadership skills

WHEREAS, the constitution does not allow students to concurrently hold a position as an executive board member in SGA and as a board member in any other student group on campus

WHEREAS, forcing students to choose between a position in SGA and any other student group leadership role limits the ability of students to grow and push themselves and may cause administrative problems for groups that have limited numbers of participants

WHEREAS, amending the constitution will allow students the flexibility to participate fully in campus activities

WHEREAS, there will be further amendments made to the constitution and this can be re-assessed

THEREFORE, LET IT BE ENACTED:

SECTION 1: The University of Baltimore SGA is requesting to amend Article 3: Section 1: Executive Cabinet from

- *At time of service must not concurrently hold any office in another branch of the UBSGA or any other student organization to*
- *At time of service, **may only hold office in one other student organization***
